Responsive Web Design

Through this exercise you'll develop the ability to test your understandings of Responsive Web Design (RWD). Specifically, you should implement fluid layouts, flexible images, and media queries. To successfully complete this task, you should be able to exhibit mastery of the objectives from Exercises 1 - 5, and you should also:

- 1) Understand the elements that constitute RWD and how to employ them
- 2) Demonstrate basic abilities with Flexbox
- 3) Generate carefully edited HTML and CSS with absolutely no errors
- 4) Test your designs on multiple platforms and browsers

Here's what you should do:

Generate two files – one HTML file and a corresponding external stylesheet for controlling layout and appearance.

You should make sure your work includes:

- 1) All styling for appearance and layout on multiple devices and browsers
- 2) Appropriate comments for all your code
- 3) The traditional lorem ipsum filler text
- 4) A navigation area with three options using flexbox
- 5) At least one image embedded in the content of the page

This represents the minimum you should do to successfully complete the exercise. You should feel free to go further – such practice will only improve your skills. In the end your browser might display something like this:
